
FRESHMAN EXPERIENCE

BACK TO THE FUTURE



This Year the Rampage is working on a series of interview-based articles dedicated to the newest recruits to the Shawsheen staff! For this issue the focus is on Dr. Milkowski. Thursday of September 14th the following interview ensued:

Q: What do you teach?

A: Chemistry and Physics: CP/CE (Junior) Chem, Honors (Senior) Physics.

Q: How long have you been teaching?

A: This is the start of my 21st year teaching.

Q: What is your favorite part about Shawsheen?

A: I really love the student's mindset when it comes to working in class. The students have great problem-solving skills and are open to working things out by themselves in the sense of the curriculum. Assigning group problems to students in the classroom and having them troubleshoot to find a solution orients students to understand the content further.



Q: What are you struggling to adjust to at Shawsheen?

Q: What is your favorite part about teaching that pushes you to continue with it?

A: I really like working with teens. It helps me gain a sense of their perspective and get to know them. Also, on a learning standard I like challenging them to think critically.
