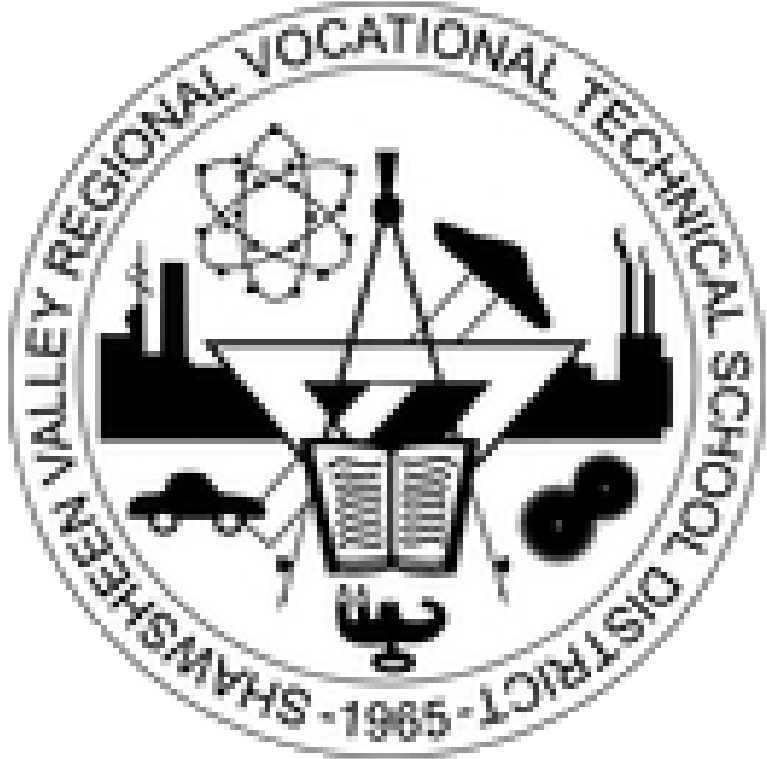

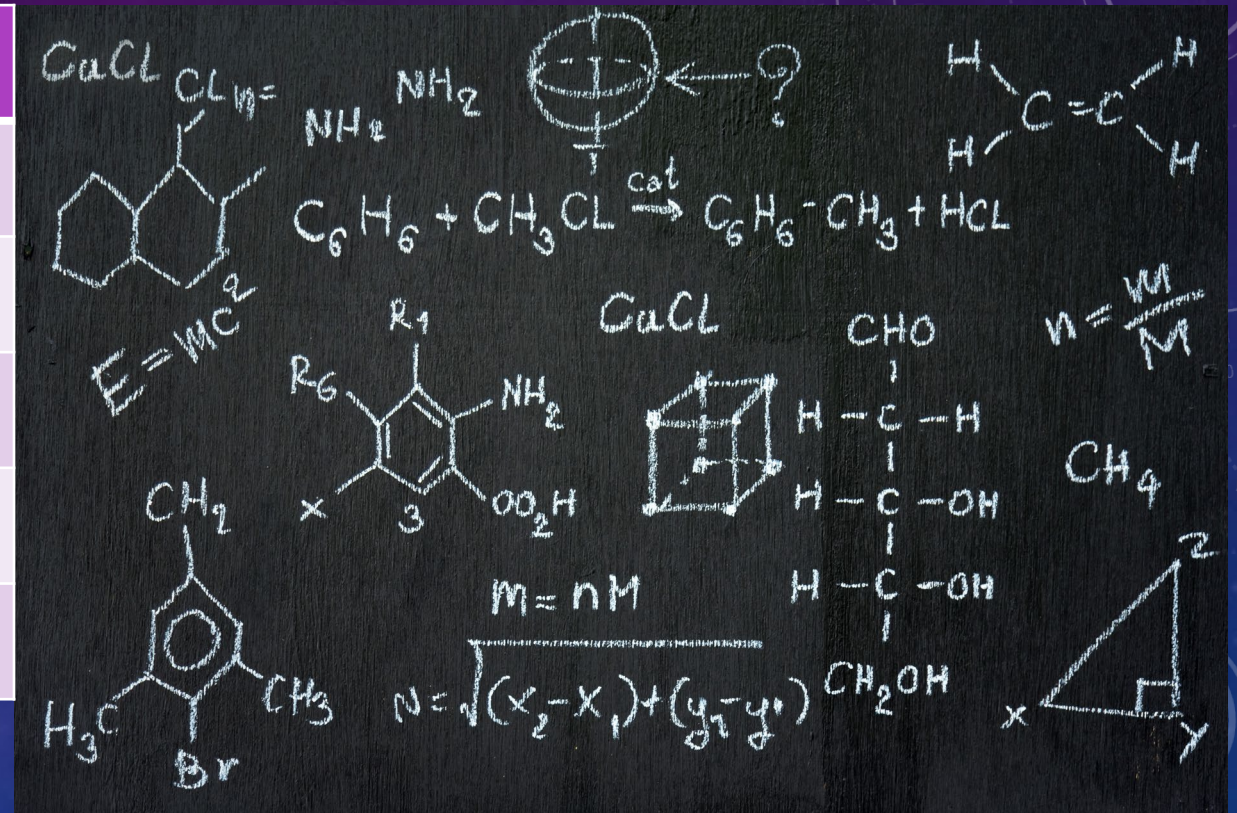

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT (CE) THINKING AHEAD TO SENIOR YEAR



Allows students to take college-level classes during their high school schedule.



Classes are taught by Shawsheen teachers who have been vetted by Middlesex Community College.

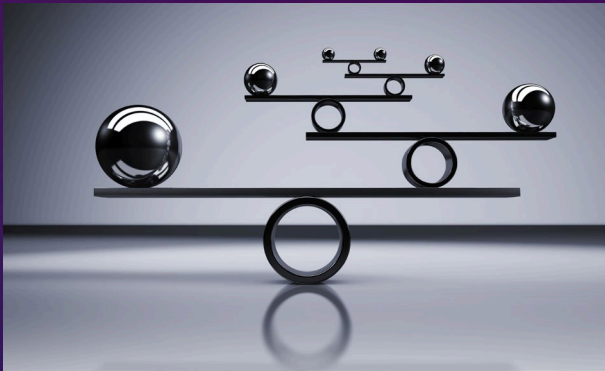


Students are delivered a rigorous college-level curriculum, and concurrently fulfill their high school graduation requirements, while also earning college credit if they elect to do so.

COURSE CHANGES



The course-selection process that takes place each spring is conducted with great care and with input from teachers and guidance counselors. **CHOOSE YOUR CLASSES WISELY.**

Course changes are disruptive to the continuity of a student's educational program and the master schedule.

All course change requests must occur prior to the end of the school year. ti

Extremely limited course change requests can be submitted within the first two weeks of school. After this time, no other requests will be granted except in extraordinary circumstances which will be handled on a case-by-case basis.
