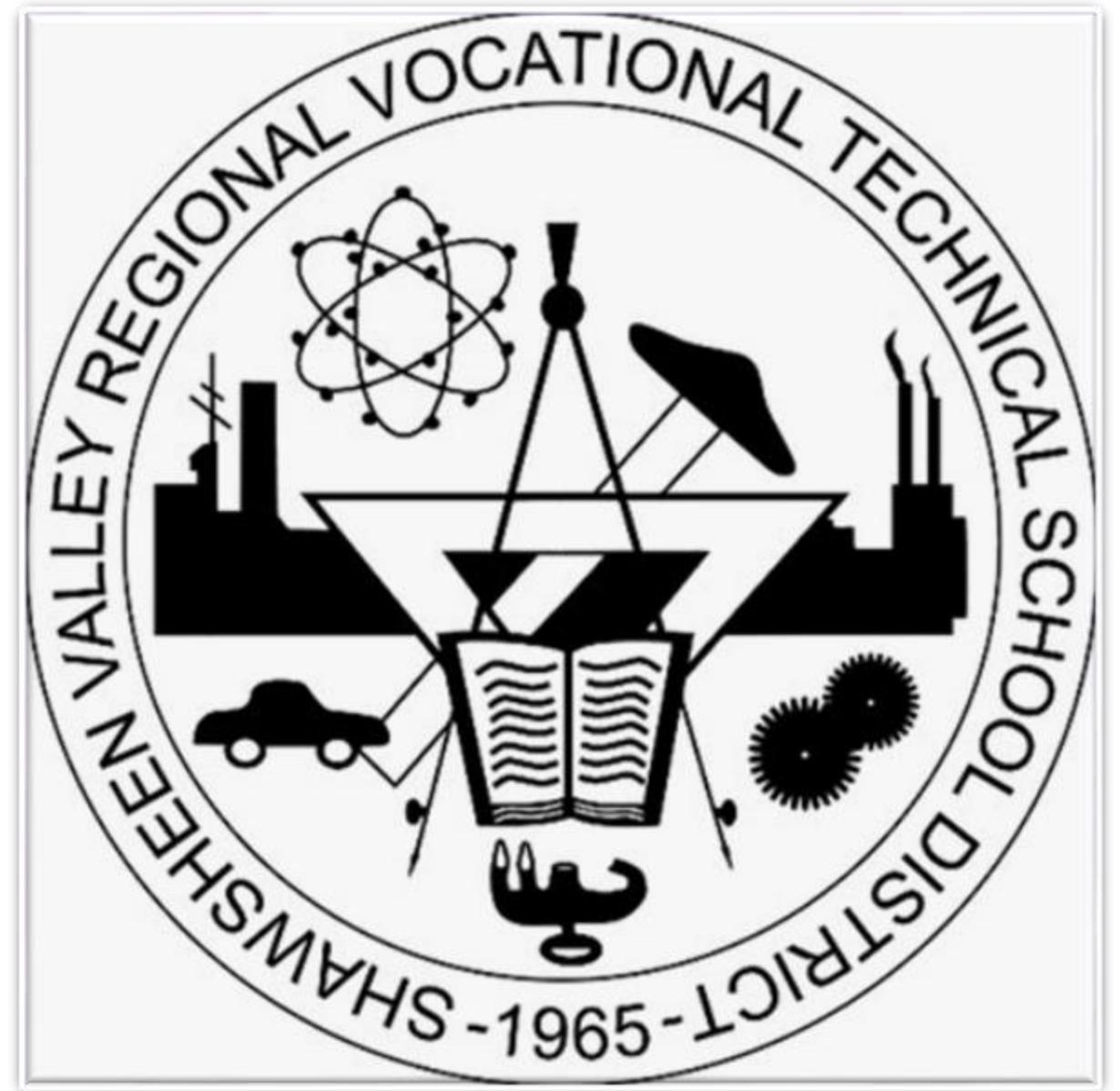

- 175 (54%) of Seniors are currently employed in a cooperative placement
- Gross wages earned to date is \$268,500

Expectations of the Exploratory Experience

- **14 Different Program Cycles**
 - **Each Cycle is Week-long**
- **All programs have enrollment capacities.**
- **A student's performance is essential in obtaining their top selection.**
- **Students will select their shop at the beginning of the 4th Quarter.**

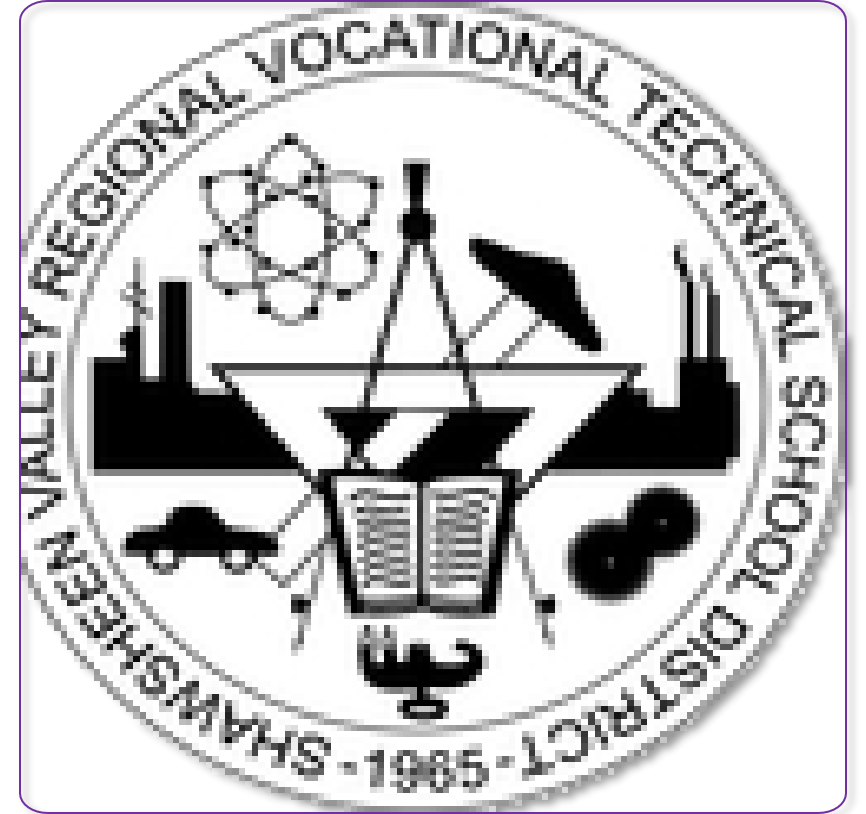


Exciting Opportunities in the years ahead

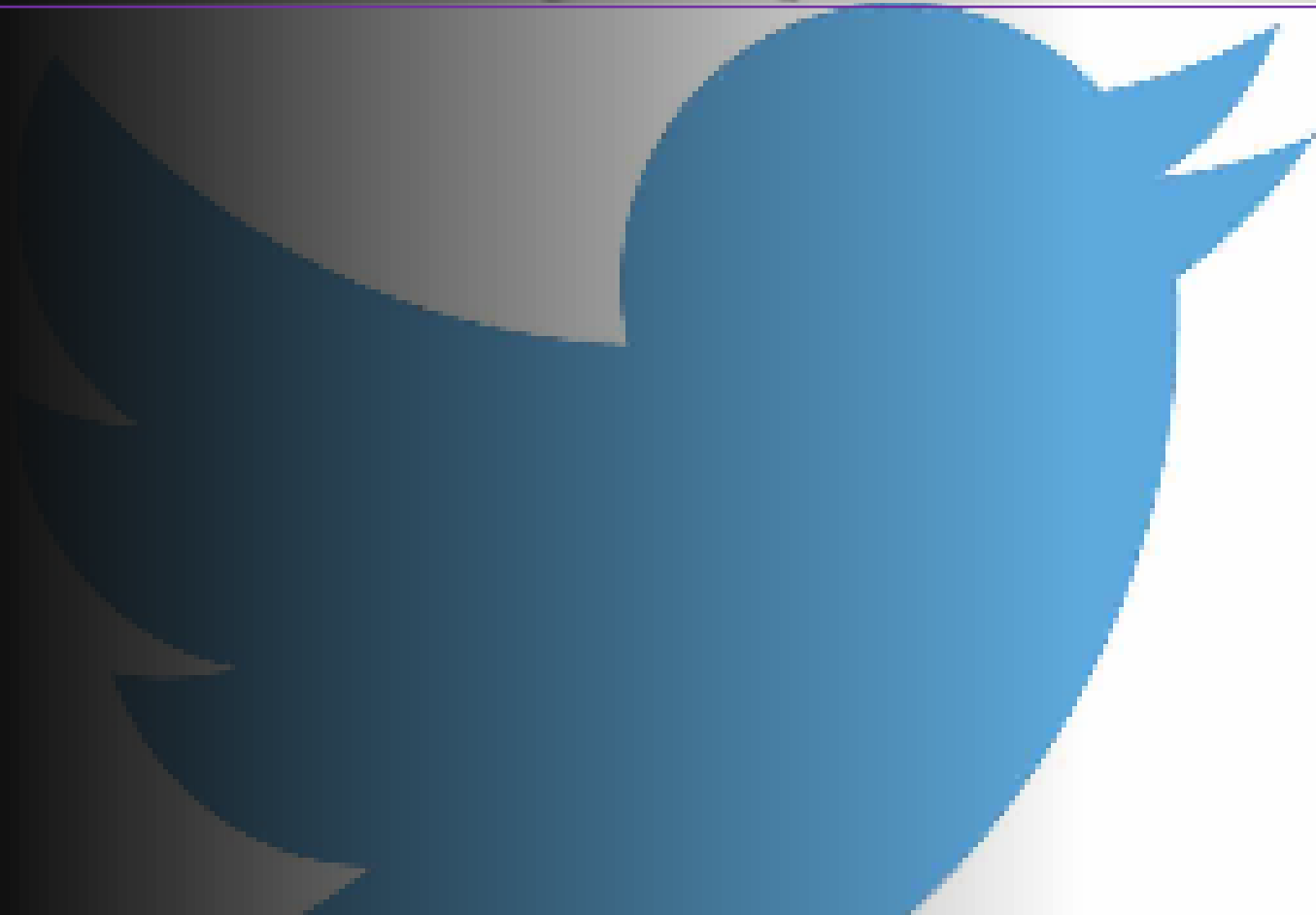
