### **UPDATED Graduation and Competency Determination (CD) Requirements**

Graduation - To fulfill graduation requirements, a student must have successfully completed or demonstrated the following:

- •Thirty-five (35) senior credits
- •Four (4) years of English, four (4) years of Wellness, three (3) years of shop, three (3) years of related theory, three (3) years of Mathematics, two (2) years of Social Studies (including United States History I and II), two (2) years of Science, and a third (3<sup>rd</sup>) year of Social Studies or Science.
- •Participate in MCAS testing for ELA, Mathematics and STE
- •Successful completion of Shawsheen Valley Technical High School competency determination requirements:
  - •Students, in the class of 2025, who have previously earned a Competency Determination (CD) through a regular or retest administration of the MCAS (including the November 2023 retest) or through a DESE appeal process, have earned their competency determination.
  - •Students at Shawsheen Valley Regional Vocational Technical High School who have not yet earned their competency determination through previous MCAS administrations can meet the requirements for a competency determination through the following:
  - •Receive a passing grade in the equivalent of a grade 10 English course
  - •Receive a passing grade in the equivalent of an Algebra 1 and Geometry course
  - •Receive a passing grade in the equivalent of a Biology, Chemistry, Physics, or Science and Technology course.



# MCAS Testing: What you Need to Know

MCAS participation is required by federal & state law—Shawsheen students must complete testing in:

- ELA
- Mathematics
- Science/Technology/Engineering

# MCAS at Shawsheen: Key Points & Testing Dates

#### Why MCAS Matters

- •MCAS participation and performance impact **Shawsheen's accountability report** from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary & Secondary Education.
- Strong results contribute to Shawsheen's reputation and post-secondary opportunities for students.

#### **MCAS Scores Are Used To:**

- Determine eligibility for the John & Abigail Adams Scholarship (scholarship money for postsecondary study).
- Qualify students for the Seal of Biliteracy.
- Assess student competency in core subjects.
- Guide curriculum improvements at Shawsheen.

#### **Important for Students & Families:**

All Shawsheen students **must complete the three MCAS assessments** to meet graduation and scholarship eligibility requirements.



<u>College-Equivalent (CE) Courses & GPA Impact:</u> CE courses appear on a student's college transcript and contribute to their overall college GPA.

Building a Permanent College Transcript: Enrolling in CE courses means starting a college transcript that will follow you throughout your academic and professional life. These grades become a permanent part of your record, impacting future college and career opportunities.

<u>Credit Transferability:</u> CE course credits are accepted by all Massachusetts Public Colleges and Universities and by most private colleges – please use this link to do your own research.


PSAT- 10 testing date April 16<sup>th</sup>

# COURSE CHANGES



The course-selection process that takes place each spring is conducted with great care and with input from teachers and guidance counselors. CHOOSE YOUR CLASSES WISELY.

Course changes are disruptive to the continuity of a student's educational program and the master schedule.

All course change requests must occur prior to the end of the school year.

Extremely limited course change requests can be submitted within the first two weeks of school. After this time, no other requests will be granted except in extraordinary circumstances which will be handled on a case-by-case basis.
